

Visiting our offices



If you would like to discuss your travel arrangements in person we welcome personal visits, although it is always best to call in advance to arrange an appointment with one or more of our country specialists.

Our offices are in the New Mill, a 17th-century converted wool mill on the outskirts of Witney in the delightful Windrush valley. There are some very pleasant walks in the area, including one directly from our office along the river, where kingfishers are a regular sighting in the summer. There is a good selection of very agreeable pubs in the immediate vicinity, two of our favourites being The Lamb at Crawley and The Royal Oak at Ramsden.

Witney is about 10 miles west of Oxford, on the edge of the Cotswolds. Driving directions are overleaf. Witney does not have a railway station but the nearby villages of Long Hanborough, Finstock and Charlbury do, although taxi services are limited. Please call us if you plan to travel by train and we can make arrangements with a local taxi company.

If you are planning to visit us from farther afield you may wish to consider staying overnight and enjoying some of the attractions of the area. Here are some of our recommendations and some accommodation suggestions.

OXFORD

As well as its historic colleges, Oxford has some excellent museums. The Ashmolean has world class art and archaeological collections, while the Natural History Museum is well



worth a visit, but perhaps of most interest to travellers is the Pitt Rivers Museum. This fascinating anthropological collection contains cases and displays of everything from shrunken heads to a dhow, as well as Wilfred Thesiger's collection of over 40,000 photographs, some of which are on permanent display.

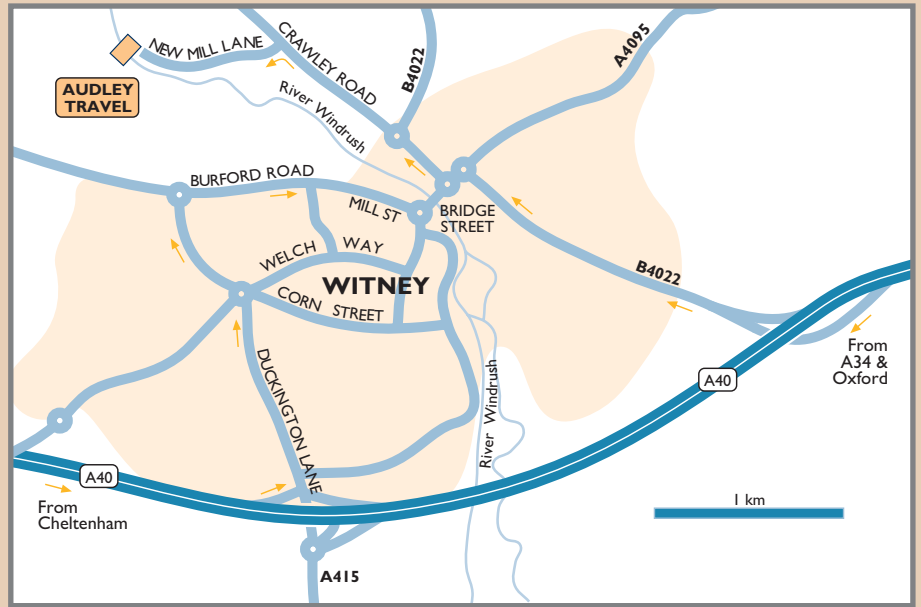
BURFORD

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO AUDLEY

New Mill, New Mill Lane, Witney, Oxfordshire OX29 9SX. Tel: 01993 838 000
Witney is located approximately 10 miles west of Oxford, just off the A40.

Directions if approaching from the Oxford side (East)

Follow the A40 from Oxford.

The A40 becomes dual carriageway as you approach Witney, take the first turning, signposted Witney and Cogges Museum.

Follow the road into Witney (B4022) going straight on at the traffic lights until you reach a mini double roundabout at which you take the left and then the right turning, signposted towards Charlbury B4022.

At the next roundabout take the first exit. Approximately half a mile along this road, immediately after a farm, you will see the sign for Audley on your left.

Turn left here and follow the single track lane to the New Mill, our offices.

Visitor car parking is available on arrival.

Directions if approaching from the Cheltenham side (West)

Take the first exit off the A40 and turn left at the bottom of the slip road. Please note that it is only possible to exit from the A40 at this junction, the second one is for west-bound traffic only.

At the first set of traffic lights head straight on until you reach a roundabout where you should take the second exit signposted Bicester. At the next roundabout turn right.

Continue along this road, going straight on at the traffic lights, until you reach a roundabout where you should turn left, signposted Bicester.

At the next roundabout turn left, signposted Charlbury B4022. At the next roundabout take the first exit. Approximately half a mile along this road, immediately after a farm, you will see the sign for Audley on your left. Turn left here and follow the single track lane to the New Mill, our offices.

Visitor car parking is available on arrival.
